After working as a Speech Pathologist for ten years, Patricia turned to her first career choice which had always been Art. She graduated from TAFE College in 1979, and since then, has worked as a professional artist, teacher and writer **and** continued post graduate studies in gilding, bookbinding, icon studies, pastel, ceramics, jewellery, calligraphy, watercolour and printmaking. She has always shared this knowledge with her students. She continues still to search for further expressive mediums. Her aim has always been to explore all possibilities.

She has been an exhibiting member of MAS Florida; Hilliard Society, England; Ku ring gai Art Society; the Australian Watercolour Institute; and Open Bite Printmakers. She is a Foundation and Life Member of the Australian Society of Miniature Art. Patricia's work is held in the collection of the Dutch Foundation of Miniature Art, Gold Coast City Gallery, Burnie Regional Gallery, Various councils, schools, universities, colleges, hotels etc. She has written many articles on miniatures for the Australian Artist and her book "Creative Miniatures" was commissioned by Simon & Schuster and published in 1991. Over the years she has won 63 awards (27 1<sup>st</sup>) and held 26 solo exhibitions in a multitude of galleries. Teaching and sharing art has taken her to various parts of Australia and overseas.
